# What is a bloodborne pathogen?

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- ❑ A bloodborne pathogen includes any blood, vomit, urine, fecal matter, or other body fluids
  - ❑ Direct contact with contaminated body fluids can cause illness to the exposed person
  - ❑ Includes Hepatitis B Virus (HBV), Hepatitis C virus (HCV), and Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV)
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# Who is at risk?

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- Household members of infected persons
  - Sexual contact with infected person
  - Travelers to underdeveloped countries
  - IV drug abusers
  - Homosexual men, multiple sex partners
  - Infants born to infected mother
  - Healthcare workers, emergency responders
  - Blood transfusions prior to 1990
  - Hemodialysis patients
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# Universal Precautions

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- ❑ This refers to using PPE at all times when risk of exposure to contaminated body fluids is possible
  - ❑ Gloves, gown, glasses, BBP baggies may be needed to protect yourself from BBP exposure
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# PPE provided by CUSD#10:

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- ❑ BBP baggies are provided to all staff
  - ❑ Includes gloves, wet wipe, dry wipe, bandaids, BBP labeled baggie
  - ❑ Custodial staff cleaning supplies for routine cleaning
  - ❑ Health staff cleaning supplies for daily cleaning of health room
  - ❑ AED program cleaning supplies for cleaning manikins and other equipment per protocol
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# OSHA guidelines

  - ❑ Those at risk for exposure to blood include school nurses/health staff, health assistants, custodians, athletic trainers, physical education and special education teachers/aides, first responders/first aide (including secretaries/principals), coaches of contact sports, playground aides
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# Hepatitis B vaccination series

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- ❑ The Hepatitis B vaccination is a series of 3 shots give over a 6 month time frame
  - ❑ The school district offers Hep B vaccine to those in the OSHA at risk categories
  - ❑ If you are in an at risk category and do not want the Hep B vaccine, you must sign a "Declination Letter"
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# Exposure control report

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- ❑ There is an exposure control report that must be completed by the staff member exposed to potentially contaminated blood or body fluids
  - ❑ This form can be found on the district website under employees/forms
  - ❑ This form must be completed within 24 hours of exposure.
