

1. <u>Use an agenda/day planner</u> Store bought or make one with a clean notebook. Students have a hard time keeping track of everything.





2. <u>Schoolwork each night (including weekends)</u> A minimum of 15 to 20 minutes per class: review or rewrite class notes, study vocabulary (flashcards/Quizlet/worksheet). Designated study area should be quiet, well lit, and no distractions.




3. <u>Sleep:</u> Eight to nine hours of actual sleep, including weekends. No "screens" at least 45 minutes prior to going to bed.





4. <u>Nutrition.</u> Fruit provides quick energy for school from its natural sugars, ideal to have with breakfast and lunch.



FRIENDLY REMINDERS

- ✓ Student-Athletes planning to try out for CMS Sports Teams must have an updated sports physical. Physicals are good for 395 days.
